

Information on LPR Access

The Jan Sofat neighborhood has enjoyed security for several decades. The Jan Sofat Residents Association (BVJS) is responsible for organizing and financing security. The security measures at the main entrance evolve with time and are being digitized.

The right lane for residents' entry is now equipped with a camera capable of reading the vehicle's license plate (LPR – License Plate Recognition) mounted at the front. The system then grants or denies entry based on the vehicle's registration in a database. This database uses the information from the government-required vehicle tax card provided by the resident, which includes the license plate number, registration address, and the owner's name. If the vehicle is not personally owned, the resident may be asked to clarify their residential status.

The data is stored in a secure and isolated database, maintained by an authorized administrative employee at the security company. The database's firewall requires offline updates to ensure data safety. All the above security measures guarantee compliance with data protection legislation. The information provided by residents is used exclusively to operate the license plate registration system of the Jan Sofat security service.

Jan Sofat is a privately financed community. Under no circumstances will we share or sell data. When a resident provides the requested documentation, it is understood that he or she agrees with these conditions. Residents retain the right at all times to request access to, or deletion of, their submitted data.

Participation in the LPR program is voluntary and free of charge. You must complete the online LPR form and upload the required documents. You are free to redact any other personal data, as shown in the example below.
